What's the gist?

- Cattails (Genus:Typha) are native plants that grow in wetlands.
- They are one of the most common plants in marshes and on the edges of ponds.
- The cattails produce an abundance of wind-dispersed seeds and they will also spread by rhizomes to rapidly colonize an area.
- Cattails are important to wildlife for food, foraging and protection. Many parts of the plants are edible to humans.
