What's the gist?

- Earthworms are the "tillers of the soil."
- The earthworm tunnels through the soil using its segmented muscular body and bristle-like structures called "setae" to grip the soil, as it burrows deep into the dirt.
- The tunnels that earthworms make aerates the soil, increasing the amount of air as well as the amount water, and nutrients in the soil. Earthworms are decomposers.
- They breakdown organic material including leaves, vegetables, dead animals, and grass.
- As they eat, they digest the food and produces waste material, aka poop, called "castings."
- The castings are made up of finely ground up organic material and is great fertilizer for the soil.
- You can even buy bags of earthworm castings to add to your soil to make it healthier and more fertile.
- Other important decomposers found in the soil are bacteria, fungi, and insects like the doodle bug.
- If you have ever picked up an earthworm, you know they are slimy to touch.
- The slime or mucus allows them to breathe.
- They live in moist soil, and they will die if their skin gets dry.
- The earthworm has a band-like structure called a "clitellum" that produces an "egg cocoon."
- The earthworm deposits eggs into this structure and transfers it into the soil.
- Earthworms do not have eyes, but they have light receptors that can sense light or dark.
- They do not have ears, but they can sense vibrations.
